### Fatherless Families

*Roe v Wade* encouraged an explosion in promiscuity and undoubtedly, abortion has become a form of contraception. Sex without consequences has resulted in fatherless families. At least 20 million American kids are growing up without their fathers in the home.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 78 % of all African American households were led by married parents in the 1950's and 60's. Today, only 26 % of homes in the African American community are led by married parents. It is no coincidence that this same community has been most devastated by abortion.

The social and economic consequences of fatherless families are truly monumental. A child living without a father in the home is 8 times more likely to suffer from maltreatment; suffers over 10 times the rate of abuse, and nearly 8 times the rate of neglect. \* Similarly, children without fathers in the home are 5 times more likely to live in poverty and twice as likely to drop out of school. They are also at a much higher risk of incarceration, drug use, teenage pregnancy and continuing the cycle of poverty.

The main victim of our culture of death is the 3,500 innocent babies who lose their lives each and every day in America. However, there are many other victims including many children born into fatherless homes. As a society, we need to urgently consider how we stop this destructive trend of abandonment. We need to listen to the wise words of Mother Teresa:

*"America needs no words from me to see how your decision in Roe v. Wade has deformed a great nation. The so-called right to abortion has pitted mothers against their children and women against men. It has sown violence and discord at the heart of the most intimate human relationships. It has aggravated the derogation of the father's role in an increasingly fatherless society. It has portrayed the greatest of gifts—a child—as a competitor, an intrusion, and an inconvenience."*

**Catechism Corner**  
**From the Catechism of St. Pius X**



*The Ninth Article of the Creed— The Pope and the Bishops*

- 56 Q.** How is it that the Pope is infallible?  
**A.** The Pope is infallible because of the promise of Jesus Christ, and of the unfailing assistance of the Holy Ghost.
- 57 Q.** When is the Pope infallible?  
**A.** The Pope is infallible when, as Pastor and Teacher of all Christians and in virtue of his supreme Apostolic authority, he defines a doctrine regarding faith or morals to be held by all the Church.
- 58 Q.** What sin would a man commit who should refuse to accept the solemn definitions of the Pope?  
**A.** He who refuses to accept the solemn definitions of the Pope, or who even doubts them, sins against faith; and should he remain obstinate in this unbelief, he would no longer be a Catholic, but a heretic.

**Sunday May 13**  
**The Ascension of Jesus**  
**Gospel Reading**  
**Mark 16:15-20**



**Jesus is taken to heaven, and the disciples go forth to preach as Jesus commanded.**

Today is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord, when Jesus was taken to heaven on the fortieth day after Easter. Scholars have long noted some irregularities about the ending of Mark's Gospel. There is a natural break in the story line at verse 8, when Mark's report of the discovery of the empty tomb comes to an abrupt conclusion. This verse reports that the women were so frightened by what they had seen at the tomb that they told no one. This may be the original ending of Mark's Gospel, but it is also possible that the more complete ending has been lost.

Some manuscripts of Mark's Gospel, written between the fourth and ninth centuries, include what scholars have termed the Shorter Ending. This ending indicates that the women told their story to Peter's companions. Scholars believe that this ending is not original to Mark. Other early manuscripts include a Longer Ending that scholars also believe was written by someone other than the Evangelist. Nonetheless, quotations from this Longer Ending are found in the writings of the early Church Fathers, and it was accepted at the Council of Trent as part of the canonical Gospel of Mark. Our Gospel for today's celebration of the Feast of the Ascension is taken from this Longer Ending.

There are similarities in the reports of Jesus' Ascension found in the Synoptic Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke. In each case, Jesus assigns his disciples the task of proclaiming the gospel message to the entire world. There are also notable distinctions. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, the disciples are sent by Jesus to baptize and to preach. Curiously, only the Gospels of Mark and Luke actually report Jesus' ascension into heaven. Matthew's Gospel concludes with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples forever. Only the Gospel of Mark notes that Jesus ascended to sit at the right hand of God. In noting this, Mark teaches that Jesus' ascension affirms the glory Jesus received from God after his death and Resurrection.

Even if this ending to Mark's Gospel was written by someone other than the Evangelist, in the commission that Jesus gives to his disciples, there are elements that are quite typical of Mark's Gospel. The signs that will accompany belief in Jesus are as vivid as the action performed by Jesus during his ministry. Those who believe in Jesus will be empowered to do what Jesus himself has done. During his ministry, Jesus sent his disciples to preach, to heal, and to drive out unclean spirits. Now they are sent again to do these things and more. From his place with God in heaven, Jesus helped his disciples, and he continues to help us as we try to live as his followers.
