CATECHISM CORNER

From the *Catechism of St. Pius X*



The Ninth Article of the Creed - The Pope and the Bishops

- 68 Q.** Must the faithful be in union with their Bishop?
A. Yes, all the faithful, ecclesiastic and lay, should be united heart and soul with their Bishop, who is in favor and communion with the Apostolic See.
- 69 Q.** How should the faithful act towards their own Bishop?
A. Each one of the faithful, both ecclesiastic and lay, should revere, love and honor his own Bishop and render him obedience in all that regards the care of souls and the spiritual government of the diocese.
- 70 Q.** By whom is the Bishop assisted in the care of souls?
A. The Bishop is assisted in the care of souls by priests, and especially by Parish Priests.



The Sacrament of Baptism



To schedule a Baptism, parents and godparents are first required to attend a Baptism Preparation class. Please call the church to register for the class or register in person at the church. Baptisms will not be scheduled until parents and godparents have attended the class and all paperwork has been turned in. The paperwork includes a St. Vincent de Paul Parish registration packet (if the family is not already registered), the Baptism registration form and sponsor certificates for the godmother and godfather.

July 15 - following the 9:00 a.m. Holy Mass
August 19 - following the 9:00 a.m. Holy Mass

(Classes are held in English unless otherwise indicated.)

Note: While Baptism classes are still offered, Baptisms are not scheduled during Advent or Lent.

Sunday Morning Holy Mass Schedule - Effective July 1

On July 1st a new Sunday morning Holy Mass schedule will be implemented. Holy Mass on Sunday mornings will be celebrated at 9:00 a.m. only. This change will only affect Sunday mornings. Saturday and Sunday evening Holy Mass times will remain the same. We hope to offer a simple breakfast on Sunday mornings following Holy Mass, when classes are in session, and possibly every Sunday. Morning Religious Education classes will take place from 10:45 a.m. to 11:50 a.m. beginning on September 9, 2018. We hope that all current Sunday morning ministry volunteers will continue to serve at the 9:00 a.m. Holy Mass.

Sunday June 10

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 3: 20-35

Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me.

In the section of the Gospel just before these verses, Jesus calls his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family.

A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. And the scribes think he is possessed by the devil. Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong man, Beelzebub, and overcomes him.

He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this. It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit. Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood.

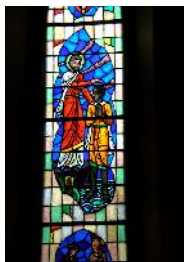
